

MUNICIPAL COURT CITY OF ASPEN, STATE OF COLORADO

AMENDED ORDER ESTABLISHING SCHEDULE OF BONDS AND FINES

The Court hereby enters the following order, effective July 5, 2022, establishing a schedule of bonds and fines for non-traffic cases, violations of the Model Traffic Code for Colorado (2018 edition as amended), and parking violations. This order supersedes and replaces all previous schedules of bonds and fines. The simplified arraignment procedures set forth in the Court's order of October 23, 1991, remain in effect.

SCHEDULE OF BONDS AND FINES FOR NON-TRAFFIC CASES

The following schedule of bonds and minimum fines is adopted pursuant to Order of the Municipal Court, City of Aspen, as authorized by Rule 210 (b) of the Colorado Municipal Court Rules of Procedure


The payment of fines in accordance with this Order may be made at the Municipal Court Clerk's Office during normal business hours or at the office of the Aspen Police Department by the defendant placing a cash deposit in an envelope furnished by the Police Department and depositing the envelope in the Bond Box located on the premises of the Pitkin County Jail. Members of the Police Department will not accept payment of fines on behalf of the Municipal Court.

The Court Clerk shall prominently post the schedules of fines wherever defendants are permitted to pay their fines. All fines and costs shall be paid to and accounted for by the Court Clerk in accordance with the Municipal Court Rules of Procedure.
