My husband's remote work helps us barely afford to live here and for me to work in the community. For him to do that he needs a dedicated office space. It's emotionally taxing and the hardest part about living here. The loss of local restaurants that people can afford and feel welcome to the numerous tax shell "art galleries" is disheartening and takes away from the sense of community I love the access to outdoor recreation.
