WHY CLIMATE ACTION?

We're facing a climate emergency and need to act! Business-as-usual operations are not responsive to the emergency. Climate change is evident in Aspen—we are seeing impacts such as:



Warmer temperatures and more frequent droughts



Shifting rain and snow patterns



More precipitation arrives as rain rather than snow



Greater risk of local wildfires that cause poor air quality

As a community that relies on its environment as part of its appeal for recreation and tourism, climate change has far-reaching implications. The City of Aspen is prioritizing climate work with a vision for a vibrant, just, and sustainable future.

WHAT DOES THE ASAP FOCUS ON?

We focus on climate action work in sectors with the largest greenhouse gas emissions contributions in Aspen. The ASAP includes goals the City of Aspen can achieve or plan for in the next five to seven years.

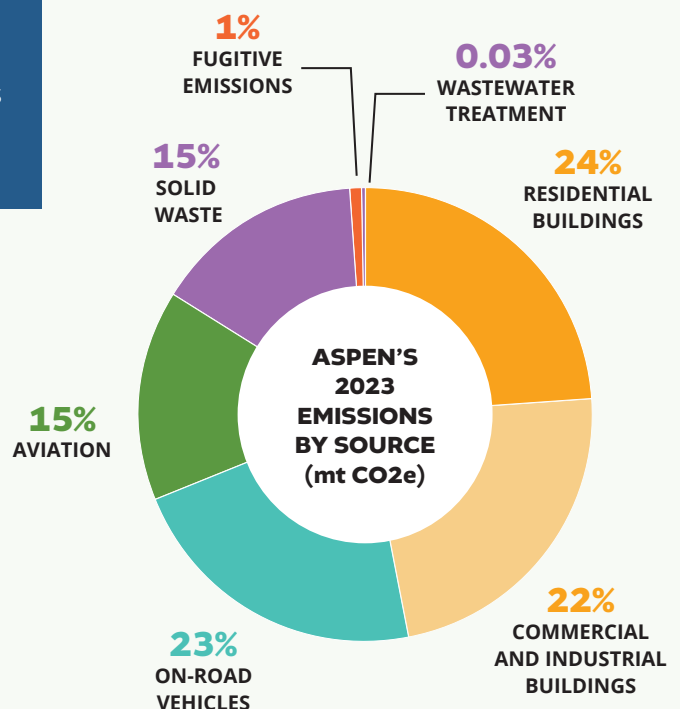

WHAT IS THE ASPEN SUSTAINABILITY ACTION PLAN?

The City of Aspen developed the Aspen Sustainability Action Plan (ASAP) as a roadmap of the goals, objectives, and action items for us to accomplish our science-based targets of

reducing greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) by 63.4% by 2030 and 100% by 2050.



The 2023 GHG inventory is the latest inventory depicting Aspen's community wide emissions footprint. The next inventory will be compiled in 2026.
